National Masonic Inter-Provincial Clay Shooting Competition 2009

RULES OF THE COMPETITION

- 1 The main competition will be held for The National Masonic Inter-Provincial Team Trophy
- 2 The competition will be based on an English Sporting Lay-out, 100 birds. over 13 stands
- 3 C.P.S.A Shooting Rules for English Sporting will apply
- 4 Classes of entry:
 - A. Masonic - All shooters must be members of a Craft Lodge
 - B. Guests - Guests should be personal friends or family members of shooters entered in the Competition.
 - C. Ladies - Ladies should be family members or friends of Masons taking part.
 - D. Juniors - Juniors must be sons or daughters of Masons and under 18 years of age
- 5 Entry fees: The entry fee for the Masonic, Guest, Ladies & Juniors Competitions will be £45.00 per shooter, payable in advance. To include 100 sporting competition and a buffet lunch
- 6 Re-entry:- For those wishing to shoot a second or even third round for fun the fee will be reduced to £35.00 for subsequent rounds
- 7 Time of shoot:- The first round will commence at 9.00 a.m. Entries will not be accepted after 2.00 p.m.
- 8 Completed score cards should be submitted by 4.30 p.m..
- 9 Team score in the National Competition will comprise of the highest three scores from Entries from any given Province. Provinces may enter as many shooters as they wish.
- 10 Guest Teams may or may not include Masons as members and must be entered in advance
- 11 The Prize-Giving Ceremony will take place at aprox. 5pm. Prize winners who are absent will not receive the Trophy unless collected by a 3rd party at the presentation
- 12 Decisions of the Organizing Committee will be final. The names of the Jury will be displayed on the day
- 13 Cartridges 1 oz (28 Grams) Load, Shot size 6 - 9 shall be used.
N.B. Failure to comply with this regulation will lead to disqualification
