

VISITING A LODGE IN ANOTHER CONSTITUTION

If an individual or group of Masons intends to visit another Lodge in another Constitution (including Ireland and Scotland) they must first ask the Province to make use of the proper channels to inquire (via our Grand Lodge) whether the jurisdiction they intend to visit is

- a) recognised and
- b) will welcome the visit.

The reply to this inquiry comes back to the Lodge or individual via the Province.

It is not permitted for Brethren or Lodges to make direct contact with another jurisdiction unless they are actually present in that jurisdiction, unless they are given specific permission by our Grand Lodge to do so.

Those intending to visit other jurisdictions should prepare themselves with their Grand Lodge Certificate, a Letter of Introduction from their own Lodge, declaring them to be in Good Standing, and they should be prepared to be proved.
