CANDIDATES FOR INITIATION FROM ANOTHER LOCALITY WITHIN ENGLAND AND WALES

If a candidate for a Lodge <u>neither lives nor works</u> in the 'locality' where the Lodge meets, he must explain to the Lodge in writing why he seeks to join that Lodge.

Once a proposal form for such a candidate reaches the Secretary, <u>but before any proposal is</u> <u>made</u>, he must ask the Province to make inquiries as to the suitability of the candidate in the locality where he lives and/or works. Note that in a Province as large as West Lancashire, 'locality' does not necessarily mean 'another Province'. A candidate for a Lodge in, say, Wigan, who lives and works in Barrow, should be subject to this procedure.

Conversely, however, a candidate for a Lodge in Chorley who lives just over the border of East Lancashire in Bolton, if well-known to the Lodge in Chorley, need not be subject to this requirement.

Candidates from Ireland and Scotland must go through a similar process but via <u>Grand</u> <u>Lodge</u>. The Province will guide and advise in such cases.
