Brethren, as I mentioned earlier, Malcolm has served the Province since 2012, formerly as a Provincial Deputy Grand Director of Ceremonies, and as the Craft Provincial Grand Director of Ceremonies for the last 4 years. I also ask that you speak to any unattached Royal Arch Masons in your lodges about them returning to a Chapter. I'm sure that you will agree, that we all need to be ambassadors for Craft and Royal Arch membership.

The support from our craft lodges and groups in terms of White Table Events aimed at attracting men into Royal Arch, has also been significant. Thank you to those lodges and groups who have embraced and supported this ongoing initiative. I very much appreciate your engagement and enthusiasm.

I particularly thank those non-Royal Arch Masons who have attended to find out more about Royal Arch Membership. I trust that they will go on to enjoy successful Royal Arch memberships together with making new and long lasting friendships.
